BUDGET WIN FOR NORTHERN NSW

In the 2020-21 NSW Budget, Northern NSW will receive funding boosts for hospitals and schools.

Key highlights from the Budget for New England and North West include:

HEALTH

- \$13 million in 2020-21 (as part of a \$60 million project) for the Inverell Hospital Redevelopment; and
- **\$500,000** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$20 million project) for the commencement of the Glen Innes Hospital upgrade.

TRANSPORT

- \$59.9 million in 2020-21 to continue the upgrade of the New England Highway at Bolivia Hill (State and Federal funded);
- \$47.1 million in 2020-21 to continue construction of the Newell Highway heavy duty pavement upgrade between Mungle Back Creek and Boggabilla (State and Federal funded); and
- **\$6.2 million** in 2020-21 for continued construction of Second Road over Rail Bridge on the Oxley Highway, Gunnedah.

EDUCATION

- **\$27.5 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$121.2 million project) for the new Armidale Secondary College; and
- **\$6.1 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$14.8 million project) to upgrade Tamworth Public School.

PLANNING

- **\$4.5 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$10 million project) to fast-track delivery of a 300 megalitre water storage facility at Walcha;
- \$1.2 million in 2020-21 (as part of a \$1.5 million project) for Uralla Shire Council
 to investigate the use of groundwater to supplement water supplies in times of
 drought; and
- \$1 million in 2020-21 (as part of a \$2.1 million project) to deliver new and upgraded quality social and affordable housing for Aboriginal communities in Inverell and Armidale.

REGIONAL NSW

- **\$4.4 million** (as part of a \$6.1 million project) for the University of New England Boilerhouse Discovery Space;
- **\$4.2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$16.8 million project) for the Narrabri Industrial and Logistics Hub;

- **\$4.2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$14 million project) for the Gunnedah Saleyard redevelopment;
- **\$3.8 million** (as part of a \$9.5 million project) for the Narrabri International Crop and Digital Agricultural Research Centre; and
- **\$3.7 million** (as part of a \$5 million project) for the Copeton Northern Foreshores Upgrade.

Key highlights from the Budget for North Coast include:

HEALTH

- **\$72.6 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$194 million project) for the expansion of Coffs Harbour Hospital;
- **\$72.1 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$673.3 million project) for the Tweed Hospital and Integrated Ambulatory Services Redevelopment;
- **\$21.4 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$312.8 million project) for the redevelopment of Lismore Hospital (Stages 3A, 3B, and 3C);
- \$6 million in 2020-21 (as part of a \$50 million project) for the Tweed Hospital Car Park;
- **\$5.9 million** in 2020-21 (as part of \$73 million project) to finalise the Macksville Hospital Redevelopment;
- **\$5 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$10 million project) for the Iluka Ambulance Station;
- **\$5 million** in 2020-21 towards the establishment of the Emmaus Memory Support Community Centre in Port Macquarie;
- **\$3.1 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$17.5 million project) for the completion of the Grafton Hospital Ambulatory Care Centre Redevelopment.
- **\$1.2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$11.5 million project) for the Port Macquarie Hospital Car Park;
- Planning for the Grafton Base Hospital redevelopment; and
- Planning for the new helipad at Port Macquarie Hospital.

EDUCATION

- More than \$100 million to establish a new Murwillumbah Education Campus to create a seamless education pathway from preschool to year 12;
- Six major upgrades for schools in the North Coast region including: Hastings Secondary College, Lennox Heads Public School, Tweed River High School, Tweed Heads South Public School, Kingscliff Public School, Kingscliff High School; and
- Upgrades for TAFE NSW Coffs Harbour Education Campus Applied Construction & Plumbing Technologies and TAFE NSW Coffs Harbour Connected Health Hub.

TRANSPORT

• **\$341.9 million** in 2020-21 to continue construction of the upgrade of the Pacific Highway between Woolgoolga and Ballina (State and Federal funded);

- \$135 million in 2020-21 for planning and early works for the Coffs Harbour bypass (State and Federal funded); and
- **\$12 million** in 2020-21 for safety, traffic and pavement improvements on the Waterfall Way.

STRONGER COMMUNITIES

• **\$20.2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$798.8 million project) to finalise the completion of the Clarence Correctional Centre, a Private Public Partnership project which has been operational since 1 July 2020.

PLANNING

- **\$5 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$20 million project) for the Coffs Harbour Jetty Foreshore precinct; and
- **\$4.2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$6.5 million project) to deliver new and upgraded quality social and affordable housing for Aboriginal communities in Coffs Harbour, Goonellabah, Lismore and Tweed Heads.

REGIONAL NSW

- **\$3.5 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$5.7 million project) for the Evans Head Foreshore Rejuvenation Project;
- **\$3.2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$5 million project) for the Port Macquarie Iconic Koala Hospital's Conservation, Education & Tourism Precinct; and
- **\$1.9 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$3.8 million project) for connecting the Harwood Marine Precinct to the Pacific Highway.
