BUDGET DELIVERS FOR SOUTHERN NSW

The Liberal & Nationals Government continues to deliver for the communities of Southern NSW with even more investment into schools, hospitals and roads as a part of the 2017-18 Budget.

Parliamentary Secretary for Southern NSW Bronnie Taylor MLC said the NSW Government understands communities in our regions deserve the same world-class infrastructure and services as in our metro areas.

"Southern NSW is an integral part of this great State, and the investment in regional communities by this budget means that Southern NSW will be an even better place to live, work and raise a family", Ms Taylor said.

Key highlights from the 2017-18 Budget include:

- **\$24.4 million** to start construction of the Ellerton Drive extension in Queanbeyan
- **\$23.5 million** in 2017-18 to continue construction for the realignment of the Princes Highway at Dignams Creek
- **\$22.8 million** in 2017-18 to for upgrades to Gocup Road between Tumut and Gundagai
- **\$135.5 million** in 2017-18 of a \$216.7 million project to deliver an additional 480 beds at Junee Correctional Centre
- \$170 million for the third stage of Wagga Wagga Hospital Redevelopment
- \$120 million for the Goulburn Hospital Redevelopment
- **\$30 million** as a contribution for the upgrade and expansion of the emergency department at Albury Base Hospital to meet the service demand
- \$10 million for the Cooma Hospital Redevelopment
- **\$6.1 million** in 2017-18 to continue the Wagga Wagga Rural Referral Hospital Redevelopment at an estimated total cost of **\$269 million**
- Over **\$730,000** to improve tracks and trails in Kosciuszko National Park
- Building and refurbishing police stations, including **\$6.2 million** for Deniliquin, **\$3.3 million** for Queanbeyan, and **\$9.9 million** for the Southern Highlands
- **\$44 million** for the planning and delivery of the Eden Wharf Extension project to develop a facility to cater for visitation of cruise ships in Eden
