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## **BUDGET INVESTS IN WESTERN NSW**

Residents and businesses in Western NSW will benefit from the NSW Government's continued investment in major and local infrastructure, sharing the benefits of the State's strong 2017-18 Budget position and continued economic strength.

Parliamentary Secretary for Western NSW Rick Colless MLC said the NSW Government understands the need for investment in our regional areas to help communities, families and businesses to thrive.

"The NSW economy is the envy of the nation and of the world. We don't have a strong budget position for the sake of it though, it's so we can invest where we need it most. And this budget does exactly that, with more investment in schools, roads and hospitals for Western NSW."

Key highlights from the 2017-18 Budget include:

- **\$9.5 million** to complete construction of the **\$40 million** realignment of the Mitchell Highway at Guanna Hill
- **\$7 million** towards a new Cobb Highway bridge over the Murray River between Echuca and Moama (NSW contribution)
- **\$25 million** to advance planning and industry engagement for the new regional XPT fleet to improve NSW TrainLink Regional train services
- Bathurst Correctional Centre Modular expansion \$59.8 million in 2017-18 of a \$110.7 million project to deliver an additional 250 beds at the existing Bathurst Correctional Centre.
- Macquarie Rapid Build Prison (at Wellington) \$25.1 million in 2017-18 of a \$188.1 million project to deliver an additional 400 beds at the existing Wellington Correctional Centre site.
- **\$8 million** in 2017-18 for the Mudgee Hospital Redevelopment to provide enhanced emergency, acute and ambulatory care services to patients in a modern, integrated facility, which will replace the existing ageing infrastructure at an estimated total cost of **\$70 million**.
- \$37.8 million in 2017-18 to continue the third and fourth stages of the redevelopment of Dubbo Hospital at an estimated total cost of \$150 million.
- **\$29.5 million** in 2017-18 to continue the Armidale Hospital Redevelopment at an estimated total cost of **\$60 million**.
- **\$9.6 million** in 2017-18 to continue the reconfiguration of the Broken Hill Hospital and Dental Facility at an estimated total cost of **\$30 million**.
- **\$2.8 million** in 2017-18 to continue the Lightning Ridge HealthOne at an estimated total cost of **\$4.9 million**.
- \$655,000 in 2017-18 for *Business Connect* services in the Central West (Barwon-Orana, Bathurst, Dubbo & Orange)

- \$24.5 million over two years for the Nimmie-Caira land and water project
- Nyngan/Cobar water security: New water storages, part of the Nyngan Cobar Water Supply Scheme, which will assist the water security of the two towns and nearby mines.
