WORLD CLASS HEALTH PRECINCT IN LIVERPOOL

Liverpool will be home to a new world-class health, research and education precinct with the NSW Government committing \$740 million for the project.

Treasurer Dominic Perrottet and Health Minister Brad Hazzard said the precinct, to be located at Liverpool Hospital, would help create thousands of jobs.

Mr Perrottet said the precinct will showcase Liverpool as a hub for innovation and emerging technologies, boost the economy and create unprecedented jobs growth.

“The precinct has the potential to double the number of jobs in the health and education sectors to around 30,000 by 2036, representing almost 25 per cent of the local workforce.”

Mr Hazzard said the capacity of Liverpool Hospital would also increase following the redevelopment works, building on the previous \$397 million redevelopment completed in 2012.

“This major redevelopment will see an expansion of Liverpool Hospital’s emergency department, neonatal intensive care, maternity and critical care capacity, as well as day surgery and radiology capacity,” he said.

Other highlights of the redevelopment include:

- a comprehensive and integrated cancer centre, providing inpatient, ambulatory, diagnostic and outpatient services and research facilities;
- additional inpatient and ambulatory care capacity; and
- integration of ambulatory care and acute care services.
