BUDGET BOOST FOR HUNTER AND CENTRAL COAST

The NSW Budget 2018 delivers major investment in a wide range of areas for the Hunter, Newcastle and Central Coast.

Some key highlights include:

- Major upgrades at Belmont High School and Rutherford Public School to meet increasing enrolment demand;
- **\$110 million** to continue construction of the Newcastle Light Rail (part of the Newcastle Urban Transformation and Transport Program);
- **\$105.3 million** in 2018-19 of a \$211.8 million investment to deliver an additional 330 maximum-security beds at the existing Cessnock Correctional Centre;
- **\$84 million** for upgrades to the New England Highway to improve safety and freight productivity (some projects include Commonwealth Government contributions) (Crosses Northern NSW Region)
- **\$55 million** towards planning and works on roads in the Hunter region to support regional economic activity and growth (some projects include Commonwealth Government contributions);
- \$31.3 million in 2018-19 to continue procurement of the Regional Rail Fleet Program to replace the aging XPT, XPLORER and Endeavour trains and create a better, safer, more comfortable and reliable service for customers travelling long distances (Crosses Western NSW Region, Southern NSW Region and Northern NSW Region);
- Continuing works on the \$348.0 million redevelopment of Gosford Hospital with \$24.2 million allocated in 2018-19 and \$7.3 million to continue the \$35.5 million Gosford Hospital car park;
- Continuing works on the **\$200.0 million** redevelopment of Wyong Hospital with **\$23.5 million** allocated in 2018-19;

- Expansion of the Manning Hospital redevelopment with **\$9.1 million** allocated in 2018-19 and a revised total cost of **\$40 million**;
- Commencing the **\$10.2 million** Wyong Hospital car park with **\$6.5 million** allocated in 2018-19;
- Continued investment in the construction of the \$470.0 million Maitland Hospital with **\$23.5 million** allocated in 2018-19
- Funding for TAFE Connected Learning Centres at Scone and Singleton;
- Commitments from the Regional Growth Environment and Tourism Fund including **\$2.9 million** towards the proposed Boardwalk Terrigal Beach to the Haven;
- Resources for Regions commitments for the Denman Revitalisation Project and the Upper Hunter Regional Mine Affected Roads Program, and;
- Planning for future new works at John Hunter Hospital.
